man to ask Me "who you were"
which your Michl Cousins must
remember - nothing made you look
off your book - I could relate much
which gave testimony of a gracious
work having begun - and may that
Grace which shone so conspicuously
in early life have influenced and
prove you to be a vessel of Mercy
and during your future life become
the Instrument of Spiritual
Good to your family circle
